

MTL SOAR is a structured reading programme that seeks to instil students' love for reading in MTL.


30 minutes of MTL lesson per week will be dedicated to reading and reading-related activities. Here are some of the activities that may be conducted during MTL SOAR periods:

## \* Tips for Parents \*

### What roles do parents play in developing their child's MTL reading habits and skills?

As parents, you play an integral role in your child's development of reading habits and skills. When your child adopts a positive attitude towards reading and has shown interest in picking up a MTL book to read, giving affirmation will help him/her to develop a greater sense of motivation in MTL reading.

You can provide a supportive environment for your child to read by playing three roles-the motivator, the role-model and the facilitator.

#### 1.The Motivator

- When your child encounters difficulty in reading MTL books, you can encourage him to persevere and look for help in overcoming the difficulties.
- Help your child to derive pleasure from reading.



## 2. The Role-Model

- Be a MTL reader yourself, this will motivate them to learn from you.
- Read MTL books together with your child to promote parent-child relationship through conversations and exchange of thoughts.



## 3. The Facilitator

- Leverage on the wide range of resources to support your child in reading.
- Encourage your child to participate in community programmes. These will enable them to discover a broader selection of reading materials beyond the curriculum.



# How can I help my child improve his/her reading skills?

## 1. Create an environment conducive for learning

Set up a comfortable library space at home. Letting your child have easy access to books will drive motivation to read.

## 2. Cultivate good reading habits


Set a routine reading time with your child and read story books or electronic books with him. Bring your child to the library or the bookshop at least once a week.

## 3. Choose reading materials wisely

Select age-appropriate books that are based on your child's interests. You could start with picture books and simple rhyming books.

## 4. Be your child's audience

Encourage your child to read the story to you even if you are unfamiliar with the language. You may also let them share with you what they have read and done in school.



# How can I help my child improve his/her reading skills?

## 5. Be well equipped to support your child's reading process

A bilingual dictionary, e-dictionary or mobile applications will come in handy when you need to check for the MTL equivalent of a particular word.



## 6. Make reading a meaningful and enjoyable process

Familiarise yourself with the book first and be animated when reading it to your child. You may use the synopsis in the Parents' Guide to help you in guiding your child to read the supplementary readers. Talk about the pictures, point to objects and ask questions. Engage your child. Let him set the pace of reading, turn the pages, role-play and talk about his/her thoughts.

## 7. Read as you play


Encourage your child to complete the tasks in his Reading Passport, such as visiting the school library and public libraries to borrow books, to receive an accomplishment certificate upon completion.

## 8. Build up a "Words Achievement List" with your child

Help your child compile a list of words learnt. Your child will have an immense sense of satisfaction when he/she sees the list grow.



## 9. Tap on external help

There are plenty of story-telling sessions in our public libraries. You could attend these sessions with your child. Mass media and technology such as audio reading of stories and rhymes, audio books and interactive learning applications can be used to support your child in the reading process.

Reader 1-4:  
Mi mi he ge ge

This book tells the story of Mi mi and her brother learning to write with a brush together. It allows children to experience the joy of brush writing and understand the bond between siblings.



Reader 1-5:  
Yiban yiban

This book, through finding objects and reading stories, allows children to experience the joy of sharing and understand the care and love between teachers, friends, and family.



Reader 1-6:  
Hemiao xiao le

This book tells the story of a goat, an elephant, and a little bird who do not eat the seedlings. It teaches children that seedlings are friends of humans and should be cared for.

Reader 1-7:  
Wo lai le

This book tells the story of Xiao He playing the role of a superhero, traveling to various places to rescue small animals. It teaches children to love and care for animals.




Reader 1-8:  
Tamen shi shei de

Yangyang and her sister saw different footprints in the sand. After careful observations, they discovered that the footprints resembled different things. Finally, they realized that they were the footprints of different animals.



Reader 1-9:  
Wanju gongchang

This story describes the process of Tiantian and Miaomiao making toys, encouraging children to use their imagination and creativity. It helps them experience the joy of making toys by themselves and the warmth of playing together with siblings.

Reader 1-10:

Lai lai lai, chi mianbao

In this story, Little Prince and his sister heads to the Bread Kingdom, where they use their creativity to make bread. After making adorable animal-shaped bread, the Little Prince and his sister invite their friends to enjoy it together, experiencing the joy of sharing.



Reader 1-11:

Dou dou zai ma

Beibei discovered that her Doudou was missing. She searched in various places and asked her parents, brother, grandfather, and the grandmother in the community. Finally, Beibei found her Doudou at home—it was a toy calf.

Reader 1-12:  
Mama wo ai nin

Mother's Day is coming. The little girl looks at the things at home and imagines using them to make a gift for her mother. What do you think she will give her mother for Mother's Day?



Reader 1-13:

Today is Little Cow's birthday. Little Elephant prepared a birthday cake to give to Little Cow. On the way to Little Cow's house, it became windy and rainy, and Little Elephant's cake got ruined. Although the cake was ruined, Little Elephant's arrival made Little Cow very happy, and everyone joyfully ate the cake together.



Reader 1-14:  
You ni zhen hao

This book tells the story of a kite's journey. During the journey, the kite helps many small animals. Everyone feels that it is great to have the kite.

Reader 1-15:

Yang yeye de jia zenme zou

Mother cow prepared some fruits for Little Cow to take to Grandpa Sheep. On the way to Grandpa Sheep's house, Little Cow got lost. Little Cow encountered various animals along the way, and they helped guide Little Cow to Grandpa Sheep's home.



Reader 1-16:

Hao xiang ah

My cousin and her family came to our house for a meal. We prepared delicious Bak Kut Teh, chicken rice, fish, and vegetables for them. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the meal.



Reader 1-17:

Nimen zhen xiang


Reader 1-25:
